The members of the Governing Body represent parents, staff and the wider local community. They offer a variety of skills which are required to manage the school effectively. The appointment of Governors and the way they conduct school business is laid down by an Education Act.

Full Governors' meetings must be held at least once a term. The detailed business is delegated to two committees who each meet as often as necessary. These committees are Children and Learning and Resources. All key policy decisions proposed by committees require the approval of the full governing body.
